- Bachelor's and Master's students in Protestant Theology and Diversity Management
- PSE students (Professional School of Education)

Students must meet the general Erasmus+ mobility requirements, including academic progress, language proficiency, and compliance with the Learning Agreement. Priority may be given to students in higher semesters, those with a strong subject match, or those for whom the exchange offers a significant academic or professional benefit.

Staff

universities and be fully employed by the University of Würzburg

All participants, both students and staff, must adhere to the nomination and application procedures as specified by the Erasmus+ program and the University of Würzburg.

Selection Criteria Student Mobility

University of Würzburg

Study phase, field of study alignment, and the benefit of the stay for academic/professional development (students in higher semesters, those with a strong subject match, or those for whom the stay has a high benefit will be given priority): 30%

Academic performance and voluntary engagement: 40% (Students with excellent academic performance and strong voluntary engagement will be given priority.)

Demonstrated financial need: 30% (Students with financial need will be given priority.)

Additional selection criteria include sufficient language skills, strong motivation, and a willingness to contribute to achieving the partnership's agreed-upon goals.

Students with disabilities, chronic illnesses, students with children, socially disadvantaged participants, and those at risk of discrimination will also be given priority and may receive an additional grant (social top-up).

The following requirements/documents are needed for the application (subject to change; please check the University of Haifa's current regulations and conditions):

You must have completed at least two semesters at a university.

A grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 or better.

A motivation letter (400–500 words).

A current Transcript of Records (2 copies: German & English). Important: The transcript must be converted to the U.S. grading system (GPA).

Confirmation from Würzburg's Ref. 1.2 European Educational Programs (Erasmus) for an Erasmus stay at the University of Two letters of recommendation from professors. Proof of English proficiency (not older than two years): English Fluency Exam – minimum score of 89 on TOEFL (equivalent to 5.5–6 in IELTS) CET 6: 435 or CET 4: 580 Level B2 in the Erasmus system Duolingo English Test: 110 Medical certificate confirming your fitness to participate in the Erasmus program. If applicable: Additional forms for the student housing contract, health insurance form, and language placement test (if taking a language course).
